Ages & Stages Questionnaire

Early childhood providers in Southeastern Indiana have been screening young children over the past year using the Ages & Stages Questionnaire (ASQ). The ASQ has been used for more than 20 years to look at how well children are developing.

This screening provides a brief glance at how young children are doing in important areas, such as communication, physical ability, social skills, and problem-solving skills. The ASQ is used to help identify children's strengths along with areas that need additional support.

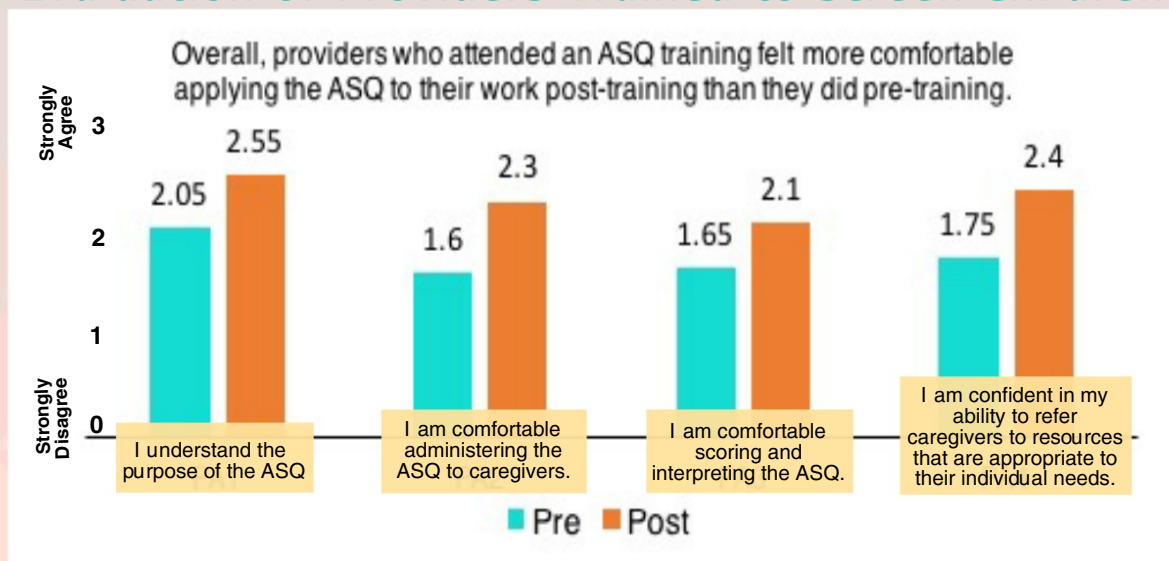
